History: The Sisters of Notre Dame de Namur, who remain involved in the school 50 years later, founded St. Lucy Parish School in 1953.

In the 1980's, an extended Day Care program was started and has evolved into a full-day program caring for up to 100 students a day.

In 2002, our new Science Center was completed providing an expanded science curriculum for all students.

In 2007, a state-of-the-art Library/Media Center was completed, with 45 20-inch iMacs, and after-school access by all students.

Staff: The school is served by 14 classroom teachers, as well as specialized teachers in art, science, music, physical education and computers, eight instructional aides, two reading specialists, an administrative staff, and six Extended Care staff. In our half-day kindergarten, the full-time staff of one teacher and two aides (with a third part-time aide) enables us to offer a strong academic program characterized by the highest level of personalized student/teacher interaction in the diocese. The student-teacher ratio in kindergarten ranges from 6:1 to 4:1.

Student

Population: 320 students; 47% female, 53% male, 98% Catholic
58% White, 10% Hispanic, 5% Filipino, 4% Vietnamese, 1% African American, and 22% Other. Twenty-two Alumni currently have their children enrolled at St. Lucy School.

Academics: Students engage in a rich and challenging curriculum that includes the following subjects:

- Language Arts (Literature, Writing, Language, and Spelling)
- Mathematics (Additional levels with smaller classes offered in grades 7 & 8)
- Religion (Inclusive of a vibrant student service component)
- Science (Life Science, Physical Science, Earth Science in state-of-the-art science lab)
- Social Studies (With frequent collaboration on art and literature projects)
- Spanish Language (Grades 6 – 8)
- Art (Taught in its own studio classroom)
- Music (With winter and spring performances)
- Physical Education (Supplemented by a broad after-school sports program)
- Computer Education (Lab features iMacs, digital cameras, and after-school access)
- Library (Focus on research skills, media literacy, and literature)

All students participate in a cross-curricular, comprehensive writing program.

Technology is integrated into instruction, and teachers collaborate on cross-curricular projects and skills instruction. All classrooms are equipped with document cameras and projectors, housed within fully outfitted multimedia carts.

On-line access to current grades is available to students in grades 4-8 and their parents.

Student and Parent Volunteerism

Student Service: St. Lucy students learn through example that we are part of a greater educational, religious and social community. Students demonstrate this belief through service to the community. Student service projects are organized at each grade level, and students in grades 6 – 8 develop service plans at the start of each school year.

Parent Service: Parents serve the school through annual volunteerism. For parents, we have many different groups and activities that you can choose to help with. Service hours to the school are mandatory, and each family is required to volunteer 40 hours per year, 20 hours per single parent family. Three shifts per family at the FunFest fundraiser are part of the parent service requirement each year. Opportunities are regularly posted on our internal communication program (SchoolSpeak).

Kids love seeing and knowing that their parents and families are doing something special at school, so we thank you for completing this commitment in making St Lucy Parish School a special community!
